AFFIDAVIT OF NAZARENA “NINA” MARTINEZ

I, Nazarena (“Nina”) Martinez hereby state:

1. I am over the age of 21 and make these statements upon personal, first hand knowledge. If I were called as a witness I would testify as stated.
2. I am the Secretary of the Republican Party of New Mexico. The Republican Party of New Mexico regularly (sometimes daily), requests a list of newly registered voters in order to provide those voters with information, to inform their vote in the upcoming election. The Republican Party of New Mexico has, in past elections, also requested and obtained on a regular basis (sometimes daily) the names and contact information of newly registered voters for this same purpose, to provide information to newly registered voters to assist them in the election process.

Theft of GOP Voter Forms Reported

As many as 200 Republican voter-registration forms were stolen after a recent burglary in Albuquerque, an activist reported to police.

James Moore of the New Voters Project told police on Sept. 12 that sometime during the night someone entered the project's office and stole about 100 to 200 Republican voter-registration forms, according to a police report filed by the Albuquerque Police Department.

Moore said it's possible that Democratic and Green Party forms may also have been among the total forms stolen.

The forms were collected by workers and volunteers from the New Voters Project as part of their ongoing voter registration drive but had not yet been delivered to the Bernalillo County Clerk's Office, Moore said in an interview. The forms were kept at the New Voter Project office, 127 Harvard SE, near the University of New Mexico.

He said the missing forms were stolen from a larger stack that had yet to be delivered.

Police reported there was no evidence at the scene that could be processed. The report will be referred to the department's burglary unit, an APD spokesman said.

Moore encouraged people to call the clerk's office at 768-4085 if they have not received a registration card in the mail.
