
DECLARATION OF ANGELINA N. JACKSON

I, Angelina N. Jackson, being of sound mind and with personal knowledge of the facts, do make this declaration pursuant to 28 U.S.C. ¶ 1746(2), under penalty of perjury:

1. I am a staff attorney with the Ohio Justice and Policy Center located in Cincinnati, Ohio.
2. I assisted in coordinating a voter registration drive for youth incarcerated at Ohio Department of Youth Services facilities throughout the State of Ohio from October 2, 2008 to October 6, 2008.
3. On Saturday, October 4, 2008, I assisted youth in registering to vote and requesting absentee ballots at Circleville Juvenile Correctional facility located in Circleville, Pickaway County, Ohio.
4. Approximately 37 youth registered to vote and requested absentee ballots for Pickaway County.
5. During and subsequent to this visit we encountered no problems with the youth registering to vote in and requesting absentee ballots for Pickaway County..
6. On October 30, 2008, I received an email from Andrew Janning, an employee of Circleville Juvenile Correctional Facility and the individual with whom I corresponded to organize the registration. A true and accurate copy of this correspondence is attached as Exhibit 1.

7. This email states that volunteers with the Pickaway County Board of Elections came to the facility and assisted 37 youth in executing their absentee ballots.

I declare under penalty of perjury that the foregoing is true and correct.
